# **All-Purpose**

## **Beginning-Intermediate:**

Basics in Rhythm, Garwood Whaley: basic reading in all time signatures, including counting & exercises. You can play drum set ostinatos over these.

Progressive Steps to Syncopation for the Modern Drummer, Ted Reed: basic 4/4 reading, syncopation, accents. This is often used for various drum set interpretations. Considered a classic!

## **Beginning-Advanced:**

Progressive Drum Method, Craig Lauritsen: set-up, practicing, grip, concepts, theory, note values & counting sight-reading exercises, syncopation, triplets, stick control, rudiments, beats, fills, solos, hi-hat openings, cymbal patterns, styles. This is one book that takes you through a little bit of everything!

# **Rudimental**

## **Beginning-Advanced Sticking, Flams, Roll Exercises:**

Stick Control for the Snare Drummer, George Lawrence Stone: Considered a classic!

### **Beginning-Intermediate Rudiments:**

Fundamental Principles of Drumming, Joe Maroni: Different time signatures, accents, 26 standard rudiments, exercises, 7 contest solos.

### **Intermediate-Advanced Rudiments:**

The Rudimental Cookbook, Edward Freytag: 26 standard rudiments, 14 P.A.S. rudiments, 43 hybrid rudiments, technique exercises, 25 progressive solos. This is used at many schools for preparing drum-line students.

### **Beginning-Intermediate:**

Alfred's Beginning Drumset Method, Sandy Feldstein & Dave Black

### **Beginning-Advanced non-Jazz:**

The New Breed, Gary Chester: Reading exercises with Concepts, 49 Ostinato systems, 10 Composite systems, 20 Gary's Grooves, Applications. This book could last you a lifetime!

### **Beginning-Advanced Jazz:**

Progressive Independence, Ron Spagnardi: snare, bass, and snare+bass independence, plus combination exercises. More gradual than Advanced Techniques for the Modern Drummer Vol.1, Jim Chapin.

# All-Purpose

### **Intermediate-Advanced:**

Rhythmic Patterns of Contemporary Music, Garwood Whaley & Joseph Mooney: mixed time signatures with rolls & flams. This will get you ready for modern orchestral music.

# **Rudimental**

## **Intermediate-Advanced:**

Accents and Rebounds for the Snare Drummer, George Lawrence Stone: designed to follow and reinforce the Stick Control book by the same author, designed to strengthen the rudimental and orchestral rolls.

# **Drum Set**

## **Beginning-Advanced Jazz/Bop:**

Advanced Techniques for the Modern Drummer Vol.1, Jim Chapin. Considered a classic!

The Art of Bop Drumming, John Riley: A great studio drummer who's done his homework!

### **Beginning-Advanced Double Bass:**

Double Bass Drumming, Joe Franco: Single stroke, 1/8 & 1/16<sup>th</sup> note patterns, fills.

### **Beginning-Advanced Afro-Cuban:**

Afro-Cuban Rhythms for Drumset, Frank Malabe & Bob Weiner: From the Drummers Collective Series, very authentic explanation of origin, styles, percussion & drum set applications.

### **Intermediate-Advanced Rock/Funk:**

Contemporary Drumset Techniques, Rick Latham: 1/8 & 1/16<sup>th</sup> note triplet sticking and 1/16 sticking with accents applied to snare & drum set time & fills, including voice displacement and substitution, interpretation exercises, hi-hat foot substitution, shuffle patterns, ghosting the shuffle, hip-hop patterns.

The Drummer's Cook Book, John Pickering: 1/8 & 16<sup>th</sup> note time pattern again linear & syncopated bass/snare patterns plus hi-hat opening patterns. A classic!

Future Sounds, David Garibaldi: Tower of Power's master of funk gives out his exercises, concepts, studies.
